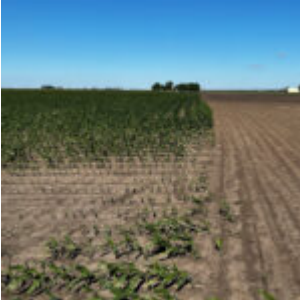

Mildly Wet (soil is wetter than normal, local vegetation is healthy)

Quick synopsis of conditions that will appear in the main feed

Early planted corn and soybean fields are in the V6 and 3rd trifoliolate stages, respectively. Most fields in the area are planted, but there are still a few fields have to be planted in the areas that received heavy rains. Ponding in planted fields is a problem in some areas. The emerged crops look good but there is a wide range in plant growth.

The few wheat fields in area are looking good with very little head scab and plant health generally looks good.
